In addition to the beginnings of fruits and veggies, there is a fledgling bee colony on the farm. 



Annual Conference June 21 - 23, 2013
The Practice of Discipleship in the Gospel of Mark

St. Mark's gospel is the first written gospel and, as such, the most bare bones, even "raw" telling of the Jesus story. After introducing the gospel, we will explore the Evangelist's view of discipleship as it relates to Jesus' radical teaching about the individual's life in community. What does it mean for our wallets, bodies and family life to be called a disciple?

Bonnie has written or edited 17 theological books and many articles, has contributed to reference works in New Testament and taught at the university level for 30 years. In 2002 she resigned from a NT chair and professorship at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary and lives as a solitary near Wheeling, WV.

Steven began his Christian journey at a very young age by attending Sunday School at one of the many Church of Scotland (Presbyterian) churches in Glasgow, Scotland.

After a few years gap, he was recruited to the local Methodist Church by a school friend and became involved in The Order of Saint Andrew. Working his way through the various Sunday School Departments, he soon became a Sunday School teacher, youth club leader, and Local (Lay) preacher, eventually conducting worship services in Glasgow and the West of Scotland.



His calling with May and their children, Stephanie and Christopher, to the Community of Celebration was some years later in 1981 when they all moved to Millport, Isle of Cumbrae. There May worked in the bakery and Steven served as office manager, covering the phones, mail, and showing visitors around the Cathedral.

In 1986 the call to ordained ministry was confirmed by the Community's Chapter and he was ordained Deacon in the Scottish Episcopal Church at St. John's Cathedral in Oban, followed by ordination to the Priesthood in 1992 at All Saints' Church in Aliquippa. He maintains his canonical residence in the Scottish Episcopal Church and presently serves as part-time clergy at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Steubenville, OH.




January: must be Robbie Burns time - och aye, th' noo!
